The College follows the syllabus prescribed by the Bharathiar University. The overall pass percentage at the Bharathiar University Semester Examination is commendable. Our students have secured many University Ranks.

The courses have been conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations laid down by the University Grants Commission, the Government and Bharathiar University.

- 1. All admissions into the College are made as per the guidelines of Bharathiar University and Tamil Nadu State Government.
- 2. Application for admission into the College should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the college office.
- 3. Normally, admissions are done only once in the beginning of the academic year.
- 4. Details regarding eligibility for admission, documents to be submitted, fees to be paid etc., are given in the prospectus issued along with the Application form.
- 5. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed in future.
- 6. If the student is absent without a valid reason and leave letter for more than five days continuously from the date of admission or reopening of the College whichever is later, the student's name will be removed from the register.
- 7. If a student leaves the College in the middle of any semester, she cannot claim remission of any portion of the fees.
- 8. Students who have completed their course of studies, can get their Transfer and Conduct Certificates after clearing the dues to the Laboratories and Library submitting written. application to the Principal.
- 9. If a student leaves the College at the end of an academic year, she can receive the Attendance Certificate required by the University if she applies for it.

#### FEES (AIDED COURSES)

- 1. Special fees for one academic year shall be paid in one lump sum not later than the tenth working day of the odd semester.
- 2. For payment of fees after the tenth working day of the semester, a fine @ Rs. 10/- for each working day shall be levied subject to a maximum of 10 working days and the name will be removed from the rolls on the 11th working day for non-payment of fees.
- 3. Absence from the College with or without leave is no ground for exemption from the operation of the above rules. If readmitted, she has in addition to the fees and fines due, to pay a re-admission fee of Rs. 10/-.

#### ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 1. Every student should attend the classes regularly.
- 2. Attendance is noted for each period at the commencement of the class.
- 3. University and College rules require REGULAR ATTENDANCE in all classes both theory and practical.
- 4. Absence of one period in any session without leave application is treated as absent for half a day.
- 5. In case of absence on medical reasons the student should produce a medical certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- 6. The leave application should be submitted only in the prescribed form available in the office/ departments.
- 7. The leave application with the counter signature of the Parent / Guardian, the Tutor (and the Deputy Warden, in case of hostel students) should be submitted in advance or on the first day of return to the College.
- 8. To appear for the University Examinations, a student has to:
- a) earn 75% of attendance for each semester and that attendance reckoned in terms of days only.
- b) satisfy the College by her conduct and progress.

- c) perform all the experiments laid down in science practicals, making a proper record of each before starting the next.
- 9. The Principal is authorized to condone deficiency in attendance upto a maximum of 10% of the number of days for each semester.
- 10. The Principal may take appropriate disciplinary action in case of continued violation of leave rules.

#### **ATTENDANCE RULES**

- 1. Absent for one period in any session (Forenoon or Afternoon), shall be treated as absent for half a day.
- 2. The monthly statement of attendance will be displayed in the Department Notice Board by the respective departments within the first five working days of the following month.
- 3. Student should earn a minimum of 75% attendance in the current semester to become eligible to write the Semester Examinations.
- 4. Candidates who earn attendance between 65% and 74% (both inclusive) are not eligible to appear for the current semester examinations. However, the Principal may condone the lack of attendance of those students on the following ground and permit them to write the semester Examinations, after the payment of condonation fee:
  - -Prolonged Illness
  - -Major surgery
  - -Accident, which demanded a long rest

The cause for the <u>long period of absence should be informed to the Principal within a week's time and get the leave sanctioned.</u>

Candidates who earned attendance about 50% & above but below 65% are not eligible to appear for the current semester examinations but permitted to write arrear subjects, if any. They are permitted to continue their studies in the next semester, while continuing in the next semester, they have to compensate the lack of attendance of the previous semester and also earn enough attendance for the current semester; otherwise, they will not be permitted to appear for both the previous and current semester examinations and they have to re-do the program from the previous semester in the following academic year, if vacancy is available, after obtaining the approval from the Bharathiar University and the Principal through the HOD concerned.

The candidates who fail to earn 50% of attendance are not eligible to continue their studies but they can re-do the program by joining the same semester in the following academic year, if vacancy is available, after obtaining the approval from Bharathiar University and the Principal through the HOD concerned. \*55% for the students admitted during the academic year 2007-2008 and onwards.

#### **CONDUCT, BEHAVIOUR AND DISCIPLINE**

- 1. Every student shall wear uniform.
- 2. The students should strictly wear Churidar/Sarees.
- 3. Every student shall greet the members of the staff on her first meeting every day.
- 4. When a member of the staff enters the classroom, the students have to stand up as a token of respect.
- 5. No student shall leave the class or laboratory without the permission of the teacher incharge.
- 6. Students shall not loiter on the verandahs during the College hours.
- 7. Students are strictly forbidden to enter other classrooms.
- 8. Students shall attend the College functions and other meetings in the College uniform.
- 9. Students are not allowed to use Mobile phones in the College Premises.
- 10. Students are advised to read notices displayed on the notice board now and then, ignorance of any notice thus put up will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.
- 11. Strict silence should be maintained while moving from classroom to laboratory and back.
- 12. Students are expected to go to the reading room/ library during leisure hours and spend the time usefully.
- 13. In case, any criminal case is registered against a student by the law enforcing authorities, she should intimate the same within 24 hours to the Principal, failing which she is liable for disciplinary action leading to expulsion.
- 14. a) Under Tamil Nadu Educational rules, the Principal is empowered to inflict the following punishments in the interest of students or the institution concerned.
- i. Fine
- ii. Loss of attendance
- iii. Loss of term certificate
- iv. Suspension and Expulsion
- b) The power to take disciplinary action against an erring student is inherent with the Head of the Institution.
- 15. With regard to the matters not specified above, students shall aim at conducting themselves in a manner thoroughly suited to the functioning of the college.

#### **RAGGING**

Ragging is strictly forbidden in the College and in the hostel. Ragging will face very severe action. The following Act of the Tamilnadu Legislative Assembly has received the assent of the Governor on the 14th February 1997 and is reproduced below:

ACT No. 7 of 1997: THE TAMILNADU PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 1997

An Act to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Tamil Nadu.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu in the Sixty Eighth year of the Republic of India as follows:

Short title, extent and commencement

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997.
- 2. (2) It extends to the whole of the State of Tamil Nadu.
- 3. (3) It shall be deemed to have come into force on the 19th of December, 1996.

#### **DEFINITION:**

In this Act unless the context otherwise requires, "ragging" means display of noisy, disorderly conduct or doing of any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear of shame or embarrassment to a student in. any educational institution and includes:

- (a) Teasing, abusing or playing a practical joke on or causing hurt to such student: or
- (b) Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.

#### **Prohibition of Ragging**

Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.

#### **Penalty of Ragging**

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates, "ragging" within or outside any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

#### Dismissal of a Student;

- Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall also be dismissed from the
  educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational
  institution.
- (1) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of the educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, such head of the education institution or person responsible for the management of the educational institution

shall enquire into the same immediately and if found true, shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.

(2) If any student indulges in ragging, under sub section (1) The decision of the Head of the Educational Institution or the person responsible for the management of the educational institution shall be binding and final.

#### FEE CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Several fee concessions and scholarships are awarded annually to the deserving students. They are tenable for the entire course on condition that the holders continue to study in the College till the end of the course and their character, conduct and academic performance should be satisfactory throughout the course.

- 1. Full fee and half fee concession under the rule 92 of the Tamil Nadu Educational Rules.
- 2. Full fee concession to sons / daughters of freedom Full fee concession to sons / daughters / fighters.
- 3. Full fee concession to sons / daughters / dependents or repatriates from Burma and Ceylon.
- 4. Full fee concession to sons / daughters / dependents of Defence Service personnel.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- 1. Full Fee Concession to all the Students.
- 2. Scholarship to SC/ST Students.
- 3. State Scholarship for SC converts.
- 4. BC Scholarship to the students of Backward Community.
- 5. MBC Scholarship to the students of Most Backward Community.
- 6. Tamil Nadu Agriculture Labour Scholarship for the daughters of farmers.
- 7. Bharathiar University Kamaraj Endowment Awards of Scholarship UG II & III Year PG II Year Best Student.
- 8. Arunachala Pradesh Stipend

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE:**

For all scholarship and fee concessions, 75% of attendance and progress in studies with good conduct are necessary.

#### **LIBRARY RULES**

- 1. The Library will be kept open on all working days between 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. including Saturdays.
- 2. Strict silence shall be maintained inside the Library.
- 3. Loud consultation, animated conversations, are strictly prohibited.

- 4. Before entering the Library, students shall deposit their personal belongings at the personal property desk.
- 5. Students should produce their identity cards with their library cards while taking books from the Library.
- 6. The borrower will be held responsible for any damage to the books or other properties belonging to the Library.
- 7. Library users may obtain books from the closed shelves with the guidance of the Librarian.
- 8. No book shall be taken out without due entry in the issue register.
- 9. Reference books must be referred in the library. Reference books cannot be taken out of the library.
- 10. Folding and tearing of the pages, underlining, clipping and annotating of books are absolutely forbidden.
- 11. All books must be returned to the Library two days before the close of the semester.
- 12. Students should not sub lend library books issued to them.
- 13. Before leaving the counter the student shall satisfy herself as to whether the books lent to her are in sound condition and if not, she shall immediately bring the matter to the notice of the Librarian. Otherwise the last borrower will be held responsible for the damge and shall replace the book or pay compensation as may be fixed by the Principal at her discretion.
- 14. Transfer Certificate or Conduct Certificate will not be issued to student unless she has returned the books and the cards issued to her and the dues, if any is remitted.
- 15. Each student will be issued with two library cards which will fetch one book each. When the book is surrendered, the card will be returned to the student.
- 16. The books should be returned on or before the due date failing which, a fine of 1 Rupee per day per book will be levied for the delay.
- 17. Students are responsible for the loss or damage of the library cards. If the card is lost or damaged the student concerned shall pay a fine of Rs. 50/ The cards are not interchangeable.
- 18. Students should take good care of the library books. If a student happens to lose any book, she should replace the book or she should pay the replacement cost of the book and a fine or both, whichever is decided by the Principal at her discretion.

#### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Physical education prescribed by the college is compulsory for the I and II year Degree class students. The Degree certificate will not be issued unless the student has 75% attendance in physical education.

#### MEDICAL INSPECTION

I Year UG and PG Students have to undergo Medical Inspection compulsorily.

Students who fail to do so are not eligible to write the examinations.

#### **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME**

The Students of the first and second year degree classes are eligible for admission to NSS.

The N.S.S. Volunteers are to fulfill the following requirements.

- 1. All Volunteers will be enrolled as members for a period of two years.
- 2. All Volunteers should regularly participate in all the activities organized by the unit. After the completion of two years a certificate will be issued to the volunteers.
- 3. All Volunteers must attend the 7 days Special Camp.

#### **YOUTH RED CROSS**

"The Youth Red Cross" Society of Emerald Heights College was started on 10th August 1998. It is based on the three fold programme of Protection of Health. Service to Sick and the Suffering, and Promotion of National and International Friendship to develop the Mental and Moral capacities of the youth.
